9.4 Caron Pond and Notre Dame Landfill

Further to questions, Mr. Darch explains that further to a thorough examination and a meeting with the Ministry of Environment, there is no

documentation showing the closure of the landfill site. Mr. Darch adds that this is why the City received an order to prepare a closure plan.

Further to questions, Mr. Darch explains that a conference call is scheduled with the Ministry of Environment to discuss details outlined in the letter sent on August 15, 2018.

Further to questions, Mr. Darch explains that the City did a lot of monitoring and research on this site but that the Ministry probably has a different opinion about the data. He adds that some quality control should be completed.

9.5 Purchase of a tractor - Community services

WHEREAS the Municipal Council approved an amount of \$80 000 for a new tractor for the Community Services during the 2018 budgetary process; and

WHEREAS following the bidding process, the lowest price obtained for the purchase of the tractor was \$82,824 (\$81,362 + 1.8% for the HST); and

WHEREAS the 2018 capital budget for the purchase of a pickup truck for the Community Services presents a surplus of \$8,000;

THAT the Committee of the Whole hereby recommends to Municipal Council to authorize the transfer of \$2,824.00 from the 2018 capital budget for the purchase of a pickup truck for the Community Services towards the 2018 capital budget for the purchase of a new tractor for the Community Services; and

THAT the Committee of the Whole recommends to Municipal Council to proceed with the purchase of a new tractor in the amount of \$82,824.00 from Reis Equipment, as recommended.

Councillor Mario Zanth asks for a street lights project update. Mr. Julian Lenhart explains that this project will begin for all streets identified in the end of September, after the capital budget update.

Councillor Carl Grimard asks for grass cutting in Du Parc Street, between Simoneau and St-Joseph streets, between the pavement and the curb. He adds

that there is grass around the street lights on Laurier Street. Mr. Lenhart replies that he will follow up with operations.

Councillor Jean-Marc Lalonde reiterates that several street lights have been burned since February. Mr. Lenhart explains that once the location of a burned light is mentioned, it is added on the list for replacements.

Councillor Michel Levert asks for clarifications about the device installed on Giroux Street. Mr. Lenhart explains that it is a meter to collect traffic data.
