

Appendix A: Automated Speed Enforcement Repeal

Effective Date

Effective November 14, 2025, municipalities will no longer be permitted to issue any Provincial Offences Act (POA) tickets or administrative penalty orders for speeding offences captured using ASE cameras that occur on or after that date. It is expected that municipalities will wind down their ASE operations in response to the repeal.

Payment of Outstanding Fines

POA tickets or administrative penalty orders issued before November 14, 2025 remain valid and enforceable, and drivers will still be required to pay these penalties in accordance with the law. Municipalities are still required to remit the Victim Component of any administrative penalties collected to the Ministry of the Attorney General (MAG).

Similarly, plate denial actions for defaulted fines related to POA tickets or administrative penalty orders that occurred before November 14, 2025 will continue and may be submitted to the Defaulted Fines Control Centre within the Ministry of the Attorney General (MAG).

Access to the Ministry of Transportation's (MTO) database for licensed information will be maintained for the period of time necessary to enforce existing tickets or administrative penalty orders. Provincial Offences Officers

MTO will begin the process to revoke the designation of Provincial Offences Officers for ASE. MTO staff will be in contact with each municipality and provide notification once the process is complete.
