# 6.1 Member's resolution presented by Councillor Mario Zanth and seconded by Councillor Samuel Cardarelli regarding the daycares closure due to the global pandemic of Covid-19

Further to questions, Helen Collier confirms that the invoices were sent out on March 1st and are due on March 31st. She adds that people who have already paid the March invoice will be credited and those who have not paid will not be billed.

# 8.4 Zoning By-law Amendment – 808 Powers St – 2701220 Ontario Inc

**WHEREAS** the Planning Department recommends that Council approve the proposed amendment to the Zoning By-law; and

**WHEREAS** the Planning Committee, at its meeting of March 4, 2020, voted against the Planning Department's recommendation;

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Council hereby adopts By-law 2020-21, being a by-law to amend the Zoning By-law 2016-10 in order to change the zoning category of the property located at 808 Powers Street from "Urban Residential First Density (R1) Zone" to "Urban Residential Second Density – Exception 29 (R2-29) Zone".

**WHEREAS** the community groups of Bourget would like to be financially involved in the Bourget Park play structures replacement project in order to increase the scope of the project; and

**WHEREAS** the Bourget community groups are asking that the Bourget Park play structures replacement project be deferred for a year to allow them to raise the necessary funds to be able to invest in the project; and

**WHEREAS** during the 2020 budget process the municipal council did not approve the funds for the Cathy Cain Park skating rink boards replacement project;

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Municipal Council authorizes the transfer of the funds allocated for the Bourget Park play structure replacement project (\$ 50,000) to the Cathy Cain Park skating rink boards replacement project; and

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Municipal Council take into consideration during the 2021 budget process, a new amount of \$ 50,000 for the replacement of the play structures at the Bourget Park; as recommended.

Further to questions, Julian Lenhart explains that the streets included in the first phase of the study had greater safety issues or were already the subject of construction projects, as Gareau Street.

Further to questions, Julian Lenhart explains that the recommendations regarding one-way directions were based on the consultant's models and scenarios.

Further to questions, Julian Lenhart explains that the issue of narrow streets for emergency and garbage trucks remains the same despite the conversion of the streets to the one-way. He adds that the only way to correct the situation is to widen the street, which is not possible.
